Purpose	To ensure the accuracy of the information provided, thereby assuring conformation of clearance requirements, in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations. To submit Transshipment Bill for transshipment cargo.					
Scope	This procedure applies to Shipping/Airline Agents (Carriers) or Freight Forwarders in the processing of transshipment cargo.

	 Submits Transshipment Bill (bill with nature 28). Upon arrival, arranges with Cargo Handler for cargo to deposited at the relevant Customs Controlled Area. Arranges for cargo to be loaded on outward craft. Submits outward bill with Customs. Customs will verify the outward bill against the origonic Transhipment bill from AW and the outward manifest. Should everything conforms, Customs will manually write the inward Transshipment Bill noting the details of the outwind bill. Customs will deal with any identified discrepancies. Carrier, Freight Forwarder or Cargo Handler must in Customs of any overstayed transship goods.
